

For the week of the twenty-fourth Sunday after Pentecost November 12th through November 18th, 2023

Notes for the Week — The Hope of the Resurrection, 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18

People will turn to this Scripture passage in order to support the false idea of "the rapture." You can see why. Paul does say, "Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air, and we will always be with the Lord." Yet, does Paul mean that Christ will whisk us away forever to live in some ethereal reality for eternity? Such a notion goes directly against the sacred witness of the rest of the Scriptures. Christ Himself says that we will "inherit the earth." He also says that the faithful will be "left behind" while those who do not believe will be "taken away" to the place of punishment. So if Paul is not talking about the rapture, then what is he talking about?

Two biblical images may help. In Revelation, 21 John sees a *new* heaven and a *new* earth. God does not renew heaven and earth simply to forsake it, but rather John sees the holy city, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God into this new creation. This new Jerusalem is all the people of God, those who Jesus brings when He comes again and those who are "caught up" with them. This new Jerusalem is brought down to dwell in the new creation with God Himself in their presence. Jesus says, "The one who conquers will have this heritage, and I will be his God and he will be my son." The new Jerusalem, the Church, are the ones who have conquered through the blood of the Lamb, Jesus Christ.

The second image is drawn from a couple of places like 2 Samuel 19, 1 Kings 1, and the Triumphal Entry of Jesus. These are images of kings coming in victory and being received by the people. Each time, all Jerusalem comes out to meet the king on the way and accompany him back into the city. Each time the king is coming in victory over those who seek his overthrow. The victory of Jesus in the Triumphal Entry is hidden by His meekness and sacrifice for us. However, when Jesus' final entry will be one marked with power over the devil, sin, and death once and for all. When He returns, we will meet him in the air as He returns to the earth.

In His conquering power, we will conquer the devil, sin, and death once and for all. When He returns, He will bring all those who have gone before us in death, and He will reunite them body and soul. Then those who are left, who are still alive when He returns, will be transformed. Our existence before the Lord forever will be spiritual, yes, but NOT because it is not physical. It will be spiritual because it will be lived in the spirit, from the Spirit. The devil, sin, and death will have no part in our eternal existence. This is our hope, to live with one another, body and soul, with Christ in the new creation forever! What a wonderful existence that will be: to enjoy God and His untarnished creation forever. May that Day come quickly!

Looking Forward to "Twenty-Fifth Sunday After Pentecost"

November 19, 2023

Readings: Zephaniah 1:7-16 | 1 Thessalonians 5:1-11 | Matthew 25:14-30

The Day of the Lord is "near and hastening fast," and it will be "a day of distress and anguish, a day of ruin and devastation" (Zeph. 1:14, 15). The Lord will search out and punish "the men who are complacent" concerning His Word, "who fill their master's house with violence and fraud" (Zeph. 1:9, 12). Then all their works and efforts will be for nothing: "Though they build houses, they shall not inhabit them; though they plant vineyards, they shall not drink wine from them" (Zeph. 1:13). But those who fear, love and trust in the Lord are "good and faithful" stewards of His property (Matt. 25:21). They live by faith in His free gift of forgiveness, and they multiply His goods in the loving forgiveness of their neighbor, and "the master of those servants" settles His accounts with them by the gracious reckoning of His Gospel (Matt. 25:19). Likewise, "God has not destined us for wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Thess. 5:9). Therefore, let us also "put on the breastplate of faith and love" in our dealings with one another (1 Thess. 5:8).
